## Adolescent Participation Checklist<sup>1</sup>

Use the checklist below to support adolescents' participation in all aspects of your work with the Adolescent Kit, especially as they collaborate with adults in their community.

- ☑ Is it voluntary? Real participation is voluntary, not forced.
- ☑ Is it accessible to all? Too often only the most confident adolescents are involved. Too often only the adolescent boys get to speak.
- ☑ Is it respectful? Real participation takes place in a climate of respect, where no one is laughed at or ignored.
- What's the point of it? Adolescents should understand why they are participating otherwise they may see participation as confusing or a waste of time.
- Who wants it? Real participation is based around issues that adolescents themselves care about and want to give their attention to.
- Does it make a difference? Adolescents should feel they are contributing and having a real influence on outcomes.
- ☑ Is the language right? Real participation requires adolescents to feel competent in the language and vocabulary that is used.
- Are participants equally prepared? Often adults have all the information, and adolescents don't.
- ☑ Is it genuine? Real participation allows adolescents to follow through on ideas the adults don't decide everything in advance.
- ☑ Is it safe? Real participation involves making every effort to ensure that adolescents aren't endangered by what they do or say.
- What happens afterwards? Real participation means adolescents are clear about what happens afterwards, and who is responsible for follow-up actions.
